### November 5th Election Brings New Voting Machines, New Procedures

**VOTING DEADLINES**: While most of us are looking ahead toward Congressional impeachment and removal votes late this year, and a primary and general election in 2020, there is another election looming large on our horizon this November. Important deadlines face us: October 7: Registration deadline, October 21: Early Voting Begins, October 25: Vote by mail application deadline, November 1: Early Voting Ends, November 5: General Election

**NEW VOTING MACHINES**: For the first time, Bexar County voters will be using new, secure voting machines designed to create a paper record along with an electronic one. While voting on these machines is similar to the past machines, there is one critical difference: *After you print out and check your paper* ballot, you have to place the paper ballot into another machine, a scanner called the "Precinct tabulator" to record your vote. Your paper ballot will then drop into a locked box to be taken to a secure location by the Bexar County Elections Department (BCED).

YOU MUST USE TWO MACHINES TO VOTE: As always, there will be trained election staff to assist you in voting at each location, but the important thing for voters to remember is this: *If you* haven't used two machines to vote, you haven't voted. Make sure you scan your paper ballot before you leave. This off-year election, though important, will be good practice for voters, and good experience for poll workers for our vitally important elections next year.

**SAME ID AS BEFORE**: As you know, the Texas DPS is in the process of notifying residents that their Drivers License or IDs must be re-issued to include the new REAL ID graphic on the right top of the card. YOU DON'T NEED A REAL ID TO VOTE in this election. Any identification voters used in the last election can be used in the 2019 election.

**VOTE ANYWHERE**: The next thing that will be different from past elections is that you can now vote at any location in Bexar County, including during early voting. Wherever you go, you won't be turned away to another location. Early voting locations will also be open on Election Day. And, as usual, all voting sites will be listed on the BCED website.

**VOTE BY MAIL**: Some voters may want to avoid the new machines altogether, and vote by mail. But to do so, voters must be 65 years or older, disabled, be out of the county during early voting and on election day, OR be confined in jail, but still eligible to vote. They must also ensure their application to vote by mail is in the BCED office by COB, no later than 11 days before Election Day.
